

CRIME ANALYSIS IN THE INFORMATION AGE

Course Overview: Using Microsoft Office as a tool, this program will demonstrate the benefits of technology in crime analysis, investigations and community policing. Classroom work will utilize selected handouts from the book "Better Policing with Microsoft Office," co-authored by the course instructor. Utilizing exercises similar to projects faced by crime analysts, participants in this three-day program will use Microsoft Access and Microsoft Excel in concert to analyze crime patterns, trends and problems.
