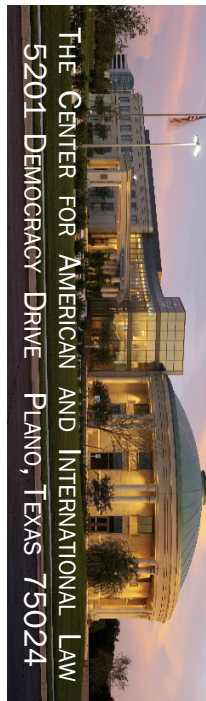
TUITION CANCELLATION
