In her book *Soldier's Heart: Reading Literature Through Peace and War at West Point*, she discusses the transformation at West Point in the days after September 11, 2001, and the impact on her students and the institution itself.

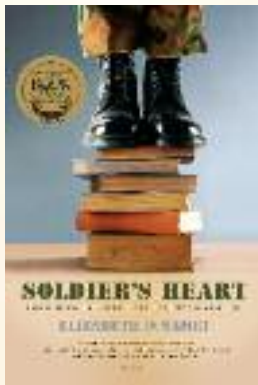
Faculty
